## TV SERIES

Woodrow Wilson, Teddy Roosevelt, Billy Mitchell and other figures of history will be brought to the TV screen Sunday evening at 6 p.m., Aug. 23, over Channel 2. "Count

With only 300 gallons of fuel remaining, the Squadron's shiny C47, aircraft number 081, touchdowned at Travis AFB, California. Piloted by Majors George R. Duncan and Vernon Flako, the military counterpart of the DC-3 logged 2300 miles after it departed from Hickam AFB on August 8. Total flying time was 14 hours and 29 minutes, about one hour ahead of schedule.

Recalled by the National Guard Bureau, the aircraft will continue on its trip from Travis to Webb AFB, Texas.

Leaving Honolulu at 1110 with a crew of four which included 1st Lt Gilbert T Fujimoto from the 169th AC&W as navigator and T/Sgt Henry Y Aoki as flight mechanic the tiny aircraft was doing 112 knots or 168 mph.

About seven hours out of Hickam, it picked up speed to 189 mph. At the point of no return (about 1000 miles from Honolulu) the plane was traveling 234 miles per hour, according to Sgt Aoki.

"I didn't have much sleep on the flight just one hour," said Sgt Aoki in a letter to the Aircraft Maintenance Section. "Crew morale and spirit was very high. Was a comfortable and smooth flight," he added.

The plane carried 1604 gallons of fuel.

The crew is expected back today.
