FIVE RECEIVE COMMENDATION MEDAL

Five Hawaii Air Guardsmen received the Hawaii National Guard commendation Medal in recognition of their 20 years of continued and devoted service to the outfit, in ceremonies in front of the hangar this morning. Honored were Col Walter F. Judd, Lt Col George R. Duncan, Lt Col Russell L. Smith, Jr., CMSgt Robert D.W. Choi and MSgt Frederick H. Rittmeister.

These five men are the only Guardsmen still members of the HANG from the original 74 officers and airmen who helped create the Air Guard in Hawaii on 10 September 1946 at Honolulu Armory. It was not until 4 November 1946 that the original units received Federal recognition.

During the last 20 years, the Groups mission has gone from fighter to fighter-bomber to fighter interceptor duty. We have flown B-26 bombers, T-6 trainers, L-5 light aircraft, C-46's and C-47 transports, F-47 Thunderbolts, T-33 jet trainers, F-86-L and F-86-E Sabre jets and the current F-102. Prior to moving to Hickam, we were stationed at Bellows Field.

Summer camps have been held at Barking Sands (Bonham), Kaneohe Marine base, Hickam, Wheeler and at Dillingham AFB.

The HANG has two full time openings for technicians: Key punch operator and a Radio Maintenance "type".

The key punch operator opening is in the Comptroller's office at Hickam with beginning pay at \$2.36 per hour. Advancement to Data processing machine operator, paying \$2.95 are possible within four months of service. Requirements for this opening include membership in the HANG and completion of a course in either key punch or IBM basic data processing equipment. Experience in IBM basic data processing equipment is desirable but not necessary. Interested persons may call the Comptroller Office at 441734.

The Radio Maintenance Technician job is at the Kokee, Kauai radar site. Basic requirements include normal color vision, security clearance and membership in the HANG. Job requirements are specified in ANG pamphlet 40-01. Applicants should write to Commander of the 150th AC&W sq., HANG, P.O. Box 827, Lihue, Kauai.

EMPLOYERS LETTERS SENT

Letters addressed to employers of Air Guardsmen are being sent out by CAMRON, CSS and other squadrons in the Group. The letters request the cooperation of business firms in allowing Guardsmen-employees to attend summer camp, alerting employers well in advance in order to plan their schedules. Summer Camp 1967 will be split into two periods: 27 March through 1 April and from 5 to 10 June.
