SAFETY MATTERS (It does!)

Prevent injury from falls! Falls may be a matter of life or death. About one-fifth of all accidental deaths are from falls.

20% of all work injuries are from falls. Average cost to USAF is about \$1,000 per injury!

To reduce falls on the job, maintain good housekeeping. Rules for cleaning up oil or liquid spills and other hazards in walking areas must be strictly enforced!

Ladders, scaffolds, platforms and other climbing equipment must be rigidly inspected and kept in safe condition.

If your shop doesn't have a checklist to use in making sure that hazards from falls are eliminated, give the Group Safety Office a call. An excellent list has been prepared by PACAFBASECOM to help in preventing injury from falls.
