
AIR GUARDSMEN NOW MAY MAKE

WASHINGTON, D.C. The latest change to AFM 35-10, the Air Force's uniform manual, has authorized persons living off base to make essential stops enroute to and from work while wearing fatigues.

The manual spells out what are essential stops enroute--grocery shopping, department store visits, service station waiting periods. Bars, recreational facilities and entertainment establishments are still off limits in fatigues.

FROM THERE IT IS UP TO THE CAR POOLERS TO GET TOGETHER AND BEGIN THEIR ENERGY SAVING TRAVEL.
