INSPECTION INSPECTION

Headquarters, PACAF has notified the Fighter Group that we are due for several inspections during the next few months. The most important of these is the annual ORI (Operational Readiness Inspection). This is the major "report card" that determines our capability. We are liable for the ORI anytime between the first of May and the 31st of July, so let's be on our toes!

In addition, the annual I.G. Inspection - a detailed administrative inspection - will begin on May 22nd, the day after our May drill. And during the same month, the SEG will be here to view our Air Crew and Missile Load Crew operations and procedures.

The importance of these inspections can't be overemphasized. This is the detailed examination of our ability to effectively and efficiently perform our mission. We know the 154th is as operationally ready as any unit in the Air Guard. It is up to us to demonstrate this capability to the inspection teams.

PROMOTIONS

Airman George E. Duncan of the 154th CAM SQ was promoted to Airman Second Class, effective April 7th. Congratulations!

Sgt. Henry M. Kajiwara has been selected as the HANG nominee for Salute To Today (Operation Muster 1967). Sgt. Kajiwara is with the 154th CAM Sq.

He can point to 17 years of experience with the Hawaii Air Guard, having enlisted with the 199th Fighter Squadron in 1949. For seven years, Sgt. Kajiwara maintained the radio and navigation equipment on F-47, B-26, C-46 and F-86E aircraft. He progressed through the ranks to TSgt and NCOIC in the radio shop.

In 1957, he left the air technician detachment to take a job with Lockheed. When Lockheed cut down its operations in the islands, MSgt. Kajiwara was selected to attend the Air Technician Course as an Electronic System Supervisor at Keesler AFB. This is the longest airman technical course in the Air Force (50 weeks), and provides advanced training in electronics and management to qualify for the E-9 grade.

Upon graduation, Kajiwara returned to the Islands, was promoted to MSgt, and became NCOIC of the Airborne Com/Nav Shop.

Sgt. Kajiwara is one of HANG's most highly qualified men, and we congratulate him on his selection as the nominee for "Operation Muster 1967".

AIR TECHNICIAN VACANCIES

The following Air Technician positions (2) will be filled effective July 2nd, 1967:

The persons selected must be federally recognized officers and be assigned a command or staff type position in a C-E unit and have at least four years of experience at this level in military or related civilian supervisory executive level. They must be qualified in all functional areas necessary to effect efficient operation of a C-E type of squadron.
