## SUMMER CAMP INFO

The "K" Staff thought it might be a good idea if we passed on to you certain basic information you ought to know. So, here goes.

Camp begins on Saturday, June 13, and ends on June 27. There will be the opening day formation and roll call for all personnel at 0730. The formation will be held at Area 61, located at March & McCord Streets.

### CAMP INSURANCE

Lloyds of London, through Hassell Davis & Co., have again agreed to extend to Reserve components a \$10,000 Accidental Death Indemnity coverage during Summer Camp only.

#### COVERAGE

Coverage includes all hazards, whether on duty or off duty; flying, whether pilot, crew member or passenger; travel enroute to camp and on return to home station, regardless of mode of travel. It is effective from 0001 hours the first day to 2400 hours the last day of camp. Limit of liability is \$240,000 any one accident.

#### COST OF PREMIUM

The premium, which is collected at the pay line, is \$2.00 for airmen and \$3.00 for officers.

### BILLETING

Airmen will be billeted at Area 61 in Buildings T-150, 151, 154, 155, and 156. You will be notified at today's formation of barracks assignment. The Orderly Room will be in Building T-156.

### UNIFORMS

The prescribed Air Force uniform will be worn during duty hours. Civilian clothes may be worn on or off base after duty hours. There is no specified uniform for athletics.

### AUTOMOBILES

Personnel may have their private automobiles at the annual field training provided they have a Hawaiian Armed Forces decalcomania. Parking space is available in the vicinity of the barracks area.

### PASSES

Airmen off-duty passes will commence daily at 1630. Pass expiration schedule is: NCO's—2400 hours; Airmen—2200 hours.

## ALERT

At 0400 yesterday, an alert was called. Within two hours, two-thirds of the Squadron were present for duty and 19 aircraft operational ready.
