## COMPTROLLER CHIEF--SUPPORT

Not everyone knows it exists, but the Comptroller Section can certainly be proud of the technical services it offers as well as "morale" support in the way of military pay and allowances.

This section is attached to the 154th Supply Squadron and includes the operational functions relating to Accounting and Finance, Budget and Data Processing and Statistical Services.

Accounting and Finance operations include all financial functions relating to procurement of material for all units of the Hawaii Air National Guard. Also included is the certification of funds and subsequent processing of obligations for all material procurement, military pay, subsistence and travel.

Budget functions comprise the operations relating to financial planning and control requirements of the HANG. In accordance with certain specific operational requirements, the budget section is responsible for providing financial funding estimates necessary to cover all operations of the HANG during annual field training. This section was also responsible for the estimation of field training pay and allowances for all of our 1,300 men in the Air Guard.

The primary function of the Data Processing and Statistical Services Section includes the utilization of EDP equipment in the centralized processing of all base level transactions such as military pay, material procurement, maintenance and base supply financial inventory accounting. The use of data automation in information processing has facilitated the processing of base level transactions by effectively reducing man-hour requirements. EDP machine utilization in the HANG has

provided a central processing center for all base level transaction and has resulted in the preparation of operational reports useful to all units of the Guard. Finally, EDP machine listings have to a great extent taken the place of manually prepared records and have thus further improved our operations in the Guard.
