

GROUP PILOT TRAINING PROGRAM ANNOUNCED

A stepped up program to recruit pilet trainees for the 154th Fighter Group was discussed in detail at this morning's GMT session by Major James Leta. The program is directed toward obtaining sufficient qualified F-102 pilots to maximize the Group's mission capabilities.

Candidates for pilot's wings must be U.S. citizens between the ages of 18 and 262. They must have had the equivalent of 60 semester hours of college education, or 90 quarter hours and be at least 5'4"

it not more than 6'4" in height.

Applicants meeting the above criteria will be given written tests by the AFSA effice here. Upon qualifying, they must then pass the flight physical examination administered by the Hickam Dispensary.

Candidates found to qualify at this point will be interviewed by a board of officers for the purpose of determining their potentials as Air Force officers. Successful candidates will be commissioned as second lieutenants in the Hawaii Air Guard.

Trainees will be sent to one of eight bases on the mainland for undergraduate pilot training, a 55-week course. Upon graduation, they are awarded the

pilot rating.

After earning his wings, the new pilot proceeds to Perrin AFB, Texas for Advance Training for F-102 aircraft (26 weeks). Upon completion of this course he returns to fly with the 199th Fighter Interceptor Squadron.

APPOINTMENT


