

HANG ROYAL GUARD TO REPRESENT HAWAII AT PRESIDENT JOHNSON'S INAUGURATION

Twenty-six Air Guardsmen of the Royal Guard will represent Hawaii in the Presidential Inaugural Farade in Washington, D. C. this week.

The HANG-sponsored Royal Guard was extended the unique honor by being picked through an official invitation forwarded to Governor Burns by the Presidential Inaugural Committee.

This is the first time that any Hawaii National Guard unit has been asked to participate in a Presidential Inauguration.

Air Guardsmen of the select Royal Guard began leaving for Washington yesterday, with the main body to depart today. All except two are from the 154th Fighter Group.

The Presidential Inaugural Parade will begin at 1330 on Wednesday, 20 January. The parade on Pennsylvania Avenue will extend from the Capitol to the White House. Honors at the Presidential Reviewing Stand in front of the White House will be Eyes Left.

The Royal Guardsmen will be hosted by the Hawaii Congressional Delegation and will tour both Senate and House chambers as well as the White House and other Washington sights.

While in the Nation's Capitol they will be accommodated in the homes of members of the Hawaii State Society of Washington.

Officer-in-charge of the unit is Major James K. Lota, CBPO. NCOIC and Kapena Moku is SMSgt Ted Hussey of the 154th Combat Support Squadron, who is to lead the Royal Guard in the parade.
