FEDERAL INCOME TAX INFO FOR GUARDSMEN

The word on 1964 Federal income tax deductions for reserve personnel is that the following expenses can be treated as deductions on your tax returns if you itemize your expenses:

a. Expense for travel when required to be away from home overnight for a paid scheduled drill.

b. Subscriptions to professional journals.

c. Cost and maintenance of uniforms worn at drills. (Uniform allowance, if received in 1964, must be deducted.)

d. Expenses for altering rank insignias, cost of insignias and devices.

e. Cost of transportation to attend drill. The cost of the round trip to location of the drill can be deducted if drills are held outside your town or the general area where you work. But, if the drill is held within your town or general area in which you work, you can only deduct the cost of traveling between where you work and the location of the drill.

f. Dues paid to HNG Association, NGUS Association, or ROA are deductible. This also applies to HNG NCO Assn dues.

EXEMPTION OF FEDERAL PAY FROM STATE INCOME TAX. The Federal pay you receive during field training and drills is exempt from Hawaii State income taxes.

HANG 2ND IN NATION IN SKT PASSING RATES

Last month our Royal Guards helped to put Hawaii on the map. This month, CBPO proudly pointed out another accomplishment which earned HANG nationwide recognition. This was made possible by all those who passed an SKT during the last six months of 1964.

The latest NGB OJT Status Report shows that of all 52 states and possessions, Hawaii's ANG ranked NUMBER TWO in its SKT passing rate. HANG's 89.6% passing rate was exceeded only by Wyoming's 90.6%. Lowest state had a 52.8%.

This score was based on the number of SKT's administered from July through December 1964. Of 115 tested, 103 local airmen passed their tests!

VETERANS MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR INSURANCE

Applications will be accepted after 1 May 1965 for those veterans of World War II and the Korean Conflict eligible to buy the new GI Insurance. Veterans administration regional offices throughout the country will take applications until the deadline of May 2, 1966.

The new law allows those veterans who served between 8 October 1940 and 1 January 1957 to buy the new insurance if they now have no GI insurance or less than the maximum \$10,000 coverage.

Another stipulation is that the veteran has a service-connected disability or a non-service-connected disability which prevented him from buying commercial insurance at the highest rates.

Last month the 154th lost a Jet Engine Mechanic to the Army NG. SSgt Allen Char received his commission as Warrant Officer to undergo training as a helicopter pilot.
